



## THE 2021 LIONEL GELBER PRIZE

# CALL *for* SUBMISSIONS

The Lionel Gelber Prize was founded in 1989 by Canadian diplomat Lionel Gelber. The prize is a literary award for the world's best non-fiction book in English on foreign affairs that seeks to deepen public debate on significant international issues. A prize of \$15,000 is awarded to the winner. The award is presented annually by The Lionel Gelber Prize, in partnership with *Foreign Policy* magazine and the Munk School of Global Affairs & Public Policy at the University of Toronto.

To be eligible for the 2021 Lionel Gelber Prize, books must be published between January 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020. The deadline for submission is October 31, 2020. Manuscripts to be published between November 1 and December 31, 2020 may be submitted in galley form. A \$100 USD per entry handling fee is required. Please make all cheques payable to the University of Toronto. Complete rules of eligibility can be found on the Prize website.

The 2020 Lionel Gelber Prize winners are Ivan Krastev and Stephen Holmes, for their book *The Light that Failed: A Reckoning* published by Allen Lane / Penguin Random House Canada.
