

The 34th Annual Lionel Gelber Prize

CALL for SUBMISSIONS

The Lionel Gelber Prize was founded in 1989 by Canadian diplomat Lionel Gelber. The prize is a literary award for the best international affairs book published in English that seeks to deepen public debate on significant international issues. A prize of \$50,000 CDN is awarded to the winner. The award is presented annually by The Lionel Gelber Prize, in partnership with Foreign Policy magazine and the Munk School of Global Affairs & Public Policy at the University of Toronto.

To be eligible for the 2024 Lionel Gelber Prize, books must be published between January 1, 2023 and December 31, 2023. The deadline for submission is October 31, 2023. Manuscripts to be published between November 1 and December 31, 2023 may be submitted in galley form. A \$100 USD per entry handling fee is required. Please make all cheques payable to the University of Toronto. The <u>submission process</u> and <u>rules of eligibility</u> can be found on the Prize website.

The 2023 Lionel Gelber Prize winner is Susan L. Shirk, for her book *Overreach: How China Derailed Its Peaceful Rise* published by Oxford University Press.
